#### **General systems theory**

- First formulated by Ludwig Van Bertalanfly, a biologist
- Acc. to Ludwig -a system is "a set of elements standing in interaction".
- ➤ In a system, internally consistent patterns are found, each interacting with other
- ➤ In social science, concept of the systems theory evolved from the general systems theory

#### **Systems theory in IR**

- \* Result of Behavioural revolution in social science
- ❖ Main focus on the structure (arrangement) of the international system
- ❖ An effort-to develop a theory of international politics
  - -to explain the behavior and interactions of the units of international system.
- ❖ Morton Kaplan- main advocate of system theory in international relations
- Perceiving international relations from the perspective of international system
- ❖ Acc. to Mortan A. Kaplan: international relations is constituted of: "international system" and "nation-state system".
- "Nation-states as the primary actors
- ❖ Impact of "change in the international system on the role of nation-state"
- ❖ Other related scholars: Kenneth Boulding, Kenneth Waltz, James Rosenau and McClelland etc.
- ❖ Kaplan in (1957) his book *System and Process in International Politics* outlines six models of international system:

#### **Morton Kaplan's Six Models**

- 1. The Balance of Power System
- 2. The Loose Bipolar System
- 3. The Tight Bipolar System
- 4. The Universal System
- 5. The Hierarchical System
- 6. The Unit Veto System

### Kaplan's 4 new systems

Later, 1969, Kaplan added 4 more international system:

- a. The very loose bipolar,
- b. The détente,
- c. The unstable bloc and
- d. The incomplete nuclear diffusion systems
